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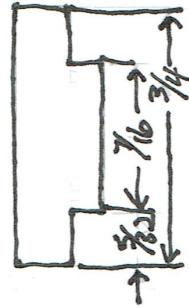
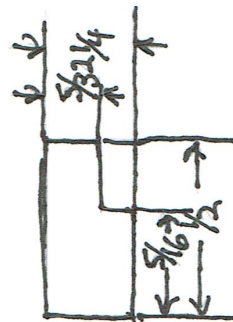
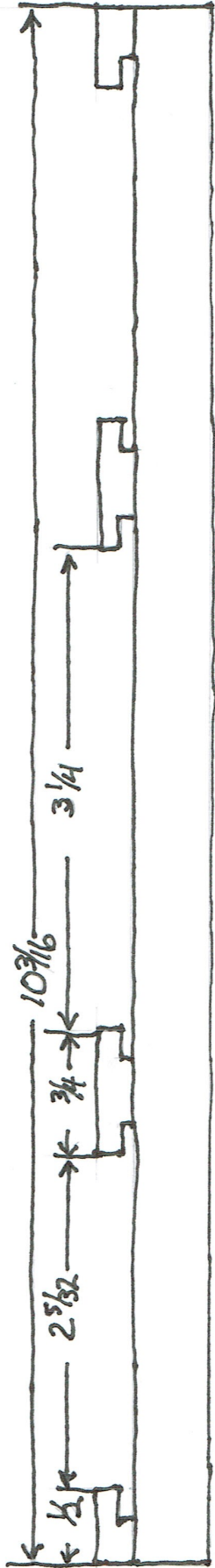
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Match Up Boards

1. Cut plywood to size.
2. Set router table up for $\frac{3}{16} \times \frac{3}{32}$ notch.
3. From a piece of $\frac{3}{4}$ scrap at least 2 feet long (for safety in the next step) run both edges through the table.
4. For the edge pieces: edge rip them to $\frac{1}{2}$ before ripping them to $\frac{1}{4}$ inch thickness.
5. Set the table saw to $\frac{1}{4}$ inch thickness and rip piece off
6. Cut top pieces to 10 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches long.
7. Glue edge pieces to top of plywood.
8. From scrap cut 2 spacers, 2 $\frac{5}{32}$ inches wide, 10 inches long.
9. Using the spacers, glue the other top pieces in place.
10. From the afore mentioned scrap piece, rip another $\frac{1}{4}$ inch piece with no notches to use for the end piece.
11. Cut end piece to length.
12. Glue en piece to end of plywood
13. Round over all edges.
14. Apply 3 coats of poly urethane.
15. Lay out and drill pilot holes, 1" apart and 1" from bottom, for screws.
16. Insert screws, leaving heads above the wood to allow for rubber bands to catch and hold.



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
